The need to equip European citizens with new skills is recognized in all the most recent EC documents (Europe 2020 Strategy, New Skills for New Jobs communication, Innovative Europe strategy), as well as the importance of ICT in acquiring these skills (both digital and non digital skills). The urgency of this can be perceived if we think that – as communicated by the European Commissioner for Education and Culture in the March 2010 University-Business Forum – 15 million new jobs will be available in Europe by 2020 that require a total or partial new skills set. To face this need, a long-term vision on the contribution of ICT for transforming education and training systems which in line with the needs of the future European knowledge society is needed, based on the analysis of existing trends on ICT of learning in Europe through a common set of shared criteria, and attentive of stakeholders’ involvement and engagement.

Against this background, the aim of the Workshop, organised by the VISIR project in cooperation with the TEL-MAP project and with the support of the LLP Programme of the European Union, is to discuss and define a shared vision on how to exploit the full potential of ICT as a leverage for innovation and change in European lifelong learning and as a way to increase and digital and key transversal skills of European citizens.

The workshop will gather around 35 European experts from different E&T sectors (school, higher education, adult learning) and will be structured along a plenary session in the morning, open to other participants, and some parallel session in the afternoon.
