GOALS

The project aims to promote the exchange of skills and experiences on the topic of collaborative housing, considered as a long-term solution to deal with all inequalities in access to housing resources due to racial, gender and generational reasons, but also to foster the development of cheaper housing solutions, the birth of supportive neighborhood networks and a more sustainable lifestyle, through the sharing of spaces and resources. The project's targets are politicians, technicians and civil society organizations operating in the field of collaborative living at a local level.

ACTIONS

The main activities of NetCo are aimed at promoting exchange through:

- 2 webinar
- 4 conferences
- 4 study visits

EXPECTED RESULTS

- Greater understanding of the role of collaborative living as an engine of social inclusion, especially after the health crisis;
- Re-evaluation of the role of public or controlled housing as a fundamental tool of the European welfare system;
- Comparative analysis of different forms of collaborative living and of the roles played in it by local administrations and civil society subjects;
- Framework of legal and administrative tools already activated and of those that can be activated in the future in the various local contexts to promote and support models of collaborative living.
